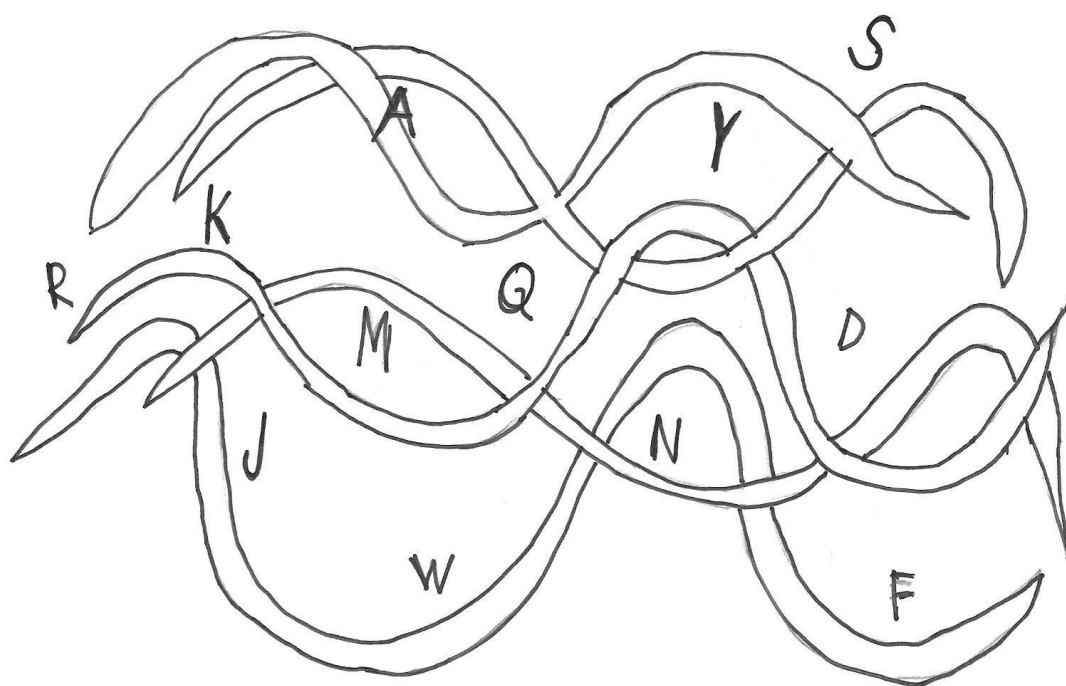

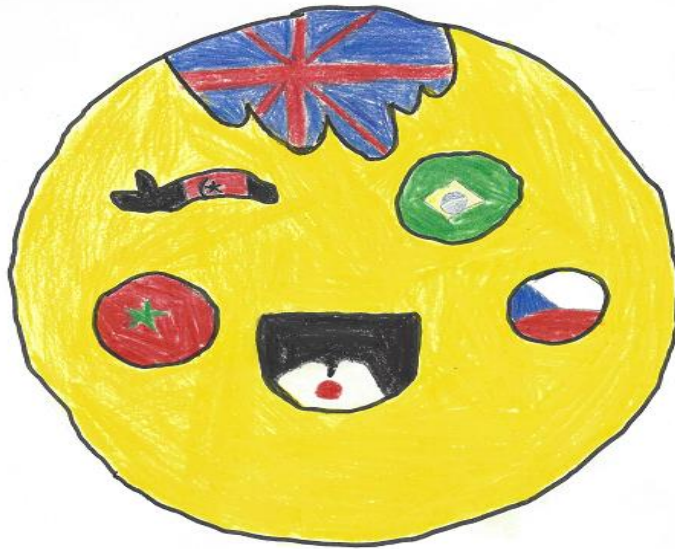
This emoji shows the infinity sign. It has flags of different countries and words in their languages. The sign shows that there are many different languages and countries in the world.

**Klara and Lara**



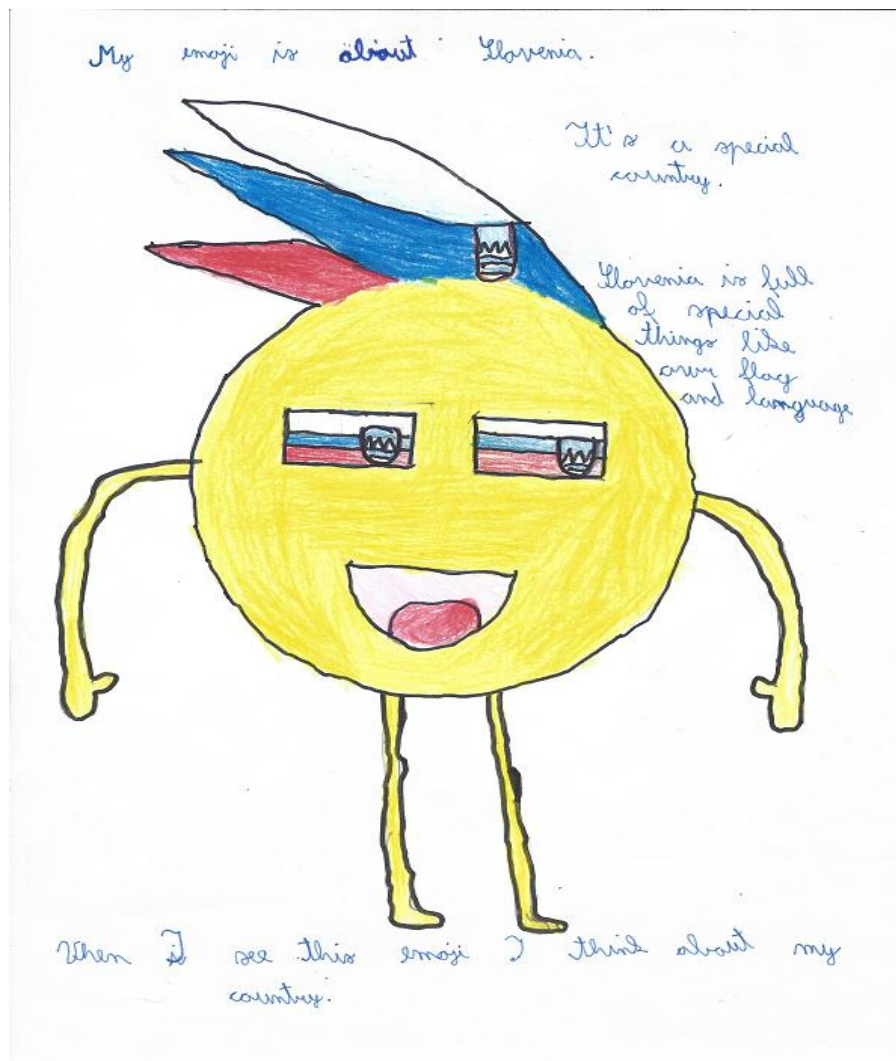
Emoji shows the world. It is colorful and has a lot of different countries and languages. It shows the questions 'How are you?' in six different languages.

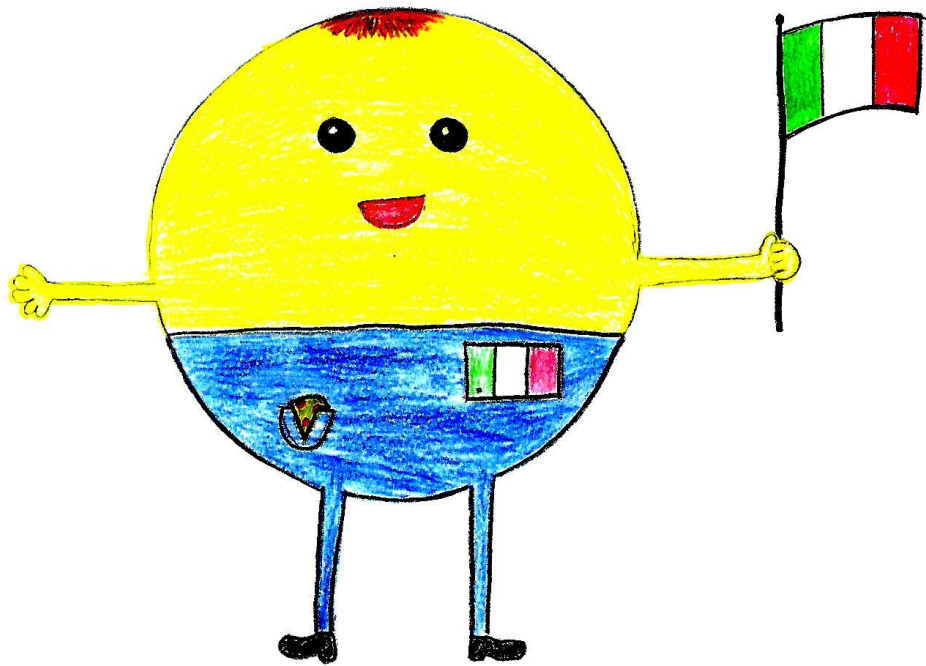


Every emoji should have its own typical traditional wear. For example I drew Japanese language emoji that has traditional Japanese hat.

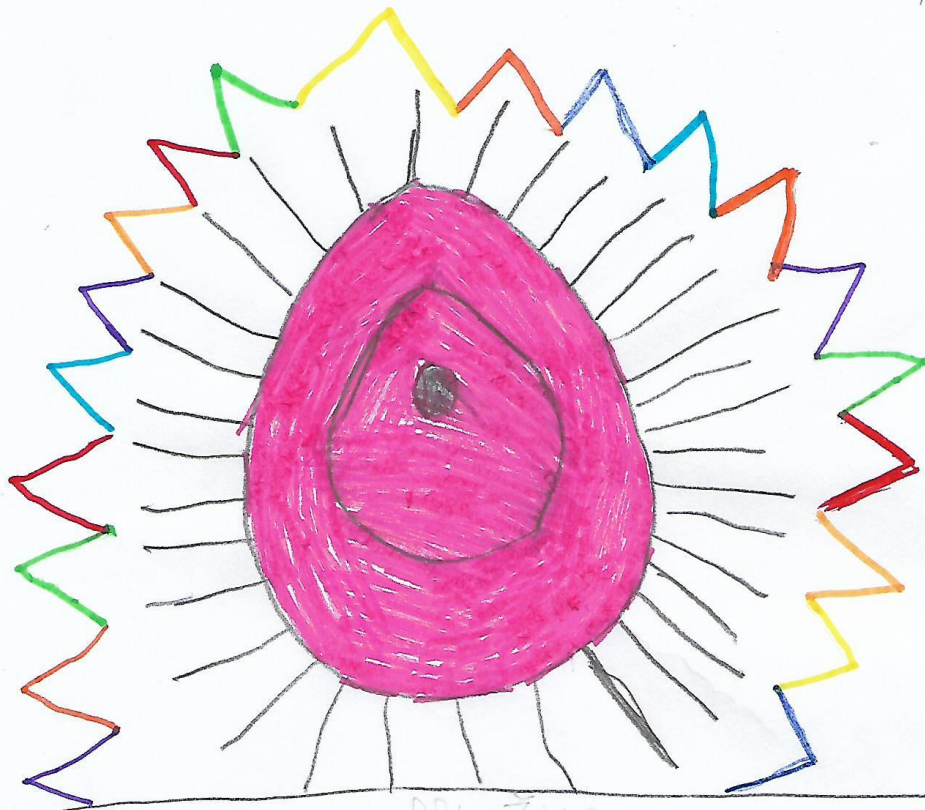
